



As an update to my post last week, concerning the Disincorporate Poetry TX S-PAC's status of being active or dissolved, I am amazed by all the "Hoopla" surrounding this particular post. The Disincorporate Poetry TX S-PAC is alive and well and completely active in the eyes of Texas. I did, however, receive this note last weekend from the Campaign Treasurer of the Disincorporate Poetry TX S-PAC ([Note](#)), but as of today, 4/21/23 her S-PAC has yet to be dissolved.

During this process, I noticed something else; there was a large effort from those that support the Disincorporate Poetry TX movement to distract and redirect folks from the real issue: their efforts to Disincorporate Poetry. None of the folks that proudly hosted yellow signs in their front yards or supported petition drives at their homes/businesses have disavowed this movement. Instead, some are doubling down and running for elected positions for the Town of Poetry. Why push so hard to try and convince everyone that the S-PAC is no more? All the S-PAC had to do was file a simple Dissolution Report. It is very easy, so I cannot understand why they say it's dead when the dissolution paperwork has not been filed.\*

\*Note, and as a courtesy to those running this S-PAC, you are also missing the donation page (who donated & in what amounts) as well as the F1 Expenditure page; these missing documents will need to be submitted because I am sure that no one believes that the 'Total Political Expenditures' only amounts to \$136. Just one mailing alone runs at least \$1000; if memory serves, you sent at least two mailings. Typically, one banner runs about \$30-50 and there were MANY banners prominently displayed on fence lines throughout the town. Corrugated yard signs tend to run about \$15-35 a piece and there were SO MANY more signs than banners! This paperwork needs to be completed correctly so the public can see where the funds came from.

The Disincorporate Poetry folks know that disincorporating Poetry is dangerous ([dangerous](#)). The disincorporation of the Town of Poetry would allow Terrell the ability to revitalize their grandfathered

Resolution 928 and have their will with Poetry--the very way that they are currently having their will with those living just outside Poetry's borders.

How do I know the Disincorporation Poetry TX S-PAC is alive and well and that Dissolution Paperwork has not been filed?

The "rumor" parroted over and over again from the Disincorporate Poetry folks is that because they have not been active for the last couple of months, the SPAC is dead. The Disincorporate Poetry folks claim that since the signs and banners are down and the petition is dead (having failed to gain enough signatures to get their measure on the ballot for the May 6th election), that the S-PAC is inactive; unfortunately, this is a false equivalency. The fact that the signs and banners are not actively on display and they are no longer actively scavenging for signatures DOES NOT MEAN that the Disincorporate Poetry TX S-PAC is not active. In order for their S-PAC to be 'dead,' they MUST FILE DISSOLUTION paperwork.

Why do they have to file Dissolution paperwork?

The State of Texas wants to know exactly what the remaining balance of the S-PAC funds is, to ensure the remaining funds are distributed in a legitimate way approved by the state. There must be a zero balance in the S-PAC's account when closed in order to dissolve. This is non-negotiable and the process has to start with filing a dissolution report. \*\*\* If you DO NOT FILE this report, you are considered ACTIVE.\*\*\*

I don't know what else to say. Two citizens are running for Poetry's town council that had 'Disincorporate Poetry' and/or 'Sign Petition' signs in their front yards that both claim legal expertise; if anyone understands how to do these reports, they do, so why has the dissolution report not been filed in order to dissolve the S-PAC?
